Transfers are open to students for the fall semester which begins on August 20.

Broward College Nursing Students Get 100 Percent Pass Rate in National Council Licensure Examination

Broward College Nursing students have once again excelled in the National Council Licensure Examination. The most recent cohort of 32 graduates who underwent the 2018 second quarter NCLEX, the (NCLEX-RN®), had an outstanding 100 percent pass rate. Between January and June of 2018, 131 graduates took the exam and 126 were successful on their first attempt. Broward College currently has a 96 percent pass rate. Broward College nursing students' phenomenal pass rate significantly outperformed the annual national average of 89.25 percent and Florida's average pass rate of 74.85 percent.

Gertrude E. Skelly Charitable Foundation Provides American Dream Scholarship



Recently, the trustees of the *Gertrude E. Skelly Charitable Foundation* invested \$15,000 to support the Gertrude E. Skelly Memorial Nursing American Dream Scholarship. The foundation's cumulative giving to Broward College is almost \$500,000.

Miss Skelly, the daughter of James T. and Gertrude M. Skelly, was born on November 4, 1918 in

Wilmington, Delaware. After attending schools in Delaware and Connecticut, she graduated from Finch College in New York City.

During World War II, while she served in the Navy auxiliary known as the WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service), her interest in the nursing profession began.

Miss Skelly established the Gertrude E. Skelly Charitable Foundation in 1991. The foundation's primary purpose is to provide medical care and educational opportunities for those who cannot otherwise afford them.

Miss Skelly died in Palm Beach County on June 22, 1995, at the age of 76. Mr. Erik Joh, lead trustee for the Gertrude E. Skelly Foundation, is committed to carrying forth her legacy for years to come.

Continuous Improvement Conference a Success Raises Money for Scholarships

The College hosted its second Continuous Improvement Conference (CIC) this year and the results were impressive. The number of attendees increased from 21 participants in 2017 to 59 this year. Gross revenue generated increased from \$5,575 to \$17,000. The objective of the Conference is to generate revenue and provide money for the Continuous Improvement Scholarship. The Conference is led by the Institutional Planning & Effectiveness team and focuses on sharing best practices in process improvement, project management, institutional effectiveness and driving transformation within organizations.

The Venture Fund, which is now close to \$600,000 in commitments, provides seed capital to launch startups based on ideas developed by the students of Broward College. The Fund is managed by the College's new Direct Support Organization, BCEduventures, Inc., and is supported by the College's Innovation Hub.

Broward College Foundation Recognizes President Emeritus Armstrong

President Emeritus David Armstrong was recognized for being the first to contribute to the new Donor Designated Fund. The fund allows contributors to designate areas of the college to support over a five-year period. President Emeritus Armstrong has committed \$25,000 of his \$100,000 gift toward the Dream Maker's American Dream Scholarship matching funds. Over the next four years, the remaining \$75,000 will be invested and distributed to key college initiatives.
