# Broward College Named Among Top Regional Colleges in the South

The 2020 U.S. News & World Report, the global authority in education rankings, again named Broward College as one of the top regional colleges in the South. The College was also ranked as one of the top performers on Social Mobility, which

recognizes academic institutions that enroll and support students who receive Pell Grants. The rankings are: 65-84 in Regional Colleges South, and 61 in Top Performers on Social Mobility (tied).

U.S News & World Report rankings evaluate colleges and universities across the nation on 16 measures of academic quality. They allow prospective students to compare the quality of U.S. colleges based on widely accepted indicators of excellence, such as first-year student retention, graduation rates, and strength of faculty.

# Broward College Launches Affordable Transportation Options for Students



Students who take classes at multiple campus locations now have access to an affordable and reliable transportation option, thanks to Broward College and the Lyft Ride Smart Program, an 18-week pilot for approximately 250 students during the fall semester. Students receive discount credits of \$6, \$10 and \$13 based on the distance between campuses. The credits are provided by the College to subsidize transportation exclusively between its three main campuses across Broward County, and for students whose lack of reliable transportation options limit their ability to pursue additional courses.
